

# Telephone Kiosk 1 and 2, St. Andrews Street, Norwich, Norfolk NR2 4AD

Opportunity to own one or two iconic red kiosks in city centre - can be sold as one lot



## **Property Summary**

- Own an iconic piece of British heritage located in town centre

#### Location

Norwich is a city in Norfolk, on the River Wensum about 100 miles north-east of London. Saint Andrew's is a fine example of a hall church and is the second largest church in Norwich, and one of the last medieval churches to be built in the city. The telephone kiosks are located on St Andrews Hill with St Andrews Street in the city centre north of the Castle Quarter.

## **Description**

These historic listed "K6" red phone boxes or "Jubilee" kiosks, were made commemorating the Silver Jubilee of the coronation of King George V. These boxes are 8'3" high and 3ft square. They were originally designed by Sir Giles Gilbert Scott, who also designed Liverpool's Anglican Cathedral, Battersea Power Station and Bankside Power Station now Tate Modern.

Historic England have listed to preserve these iconic red kiosks, and many have transformed them to coffee shops, libraries, museums, bakeries, and defibrillators. In Cheltenham, 10 red phone boxes have been transformed into miniature art galleries, showcasing the work of local artists. The kiosks are due to be newly painted and refurbished.

### **Tenure**

You own the kiosk and can resell at any point, but it is heritage site, so cannot remove them or alter the exterior. The kiosk is registered as a Listed Building at Historic England (see www.historicengland.org.uk)
